Great comedy with the likes of Gary Delaney and Mark Watson in February, our regular live poetry club continues with Elvis Mcgonagall in November, music-wise there are plenty of good gigs with blues legends Dave Kelly and Paul Jones in January and Scottish Folk stalwarts, the Peatbog Fairies with us in March. There's also plenty of films and theatre and none of this happens if you don't come along, so treat yourself to an evening out!

I've also been incredibly impressed with the community work that The Corn Hall does in hosting all sorts of groups and meetings backed up by our daytime gallery and cafe. The Diss Arts Society have stimulating art talks once a month and are looking for new members, we host two daytime groups for older people who might be isolated and need support, and there are several opportunities for young people to take part in arts activities. We can help young people work towards an official Arts Award. Please get in touch if any of this is relevant for you and look out four our fundraising BIG GIVE in December which will be aimed at supporting this community activity.

James Dodds - Shaped by the Sea

Described as 'boatbuilding's artist laureate', James Dodds was apprenticed as a shipwright in Maldon for four years. "With the first boat I worked on, it felt I was building it on the canvas. The two sides of me, the builder and the artist; one focused on art and colour, the other on practicalities." The desire to become an artist won and took him to Colchester School of Art and then to London to Chelsea School of Art and the Royal College.

James' studio in Wivenhoe is sited on the spot where great ships were once built and our exhibition will have a special emphasis on East Coast boats including a mammoth 12ft triptych of a Yarmouth Lugger and a selection of his distinctive linocuts. These will contain 'panoramas' of coastal towns such as Southwold and Aldeburgh and historic working boats such as the 1864 oyster dredger 'Pioneer', rescued from the mud where she had lain for 50 years.

Diss Elephants 2022

Are there really two elephants buried under Fair Green?

The Corn Hall, in partnership with Eastern Region Media, has been granted National Lottery Heritage Funding to explore the legend of Madame Abdella, a 20 year old Burmese elephant who died while travelling with a menagerie in 1867 and is believed to be buried on Fair Green. A second elephant travelling with a circus in the 1940s is also rumoured to be buried on Fair Green.


ACCESSIBILITY
