In December we have 18 performances of our Pantomime, Cinderella. The Corn Hall panto has grown and grown over the years and is now firmly established as part of the Diss Christmas celebrations. Please tell your friends and bring em along! As an innovation this year we have 2 performances of our Adult Panto – Snow White and the Seven Inches, so do check that out but be careful when you're booking your tickets!

The art exhibitions this season are excellent with a joint exhibition by **Jo and Gary Hincks** in the autumn followed by Norwich based artist **Will Teather** in December. These are preceded by our annual **designermakers21** exhibition. They are currently fundraising to purchase their building across the road from us in Diss. It's a great creative collective and worthy of support.

On a day-to-day basis the Corn Hall acts as a valuable community hub hosting a regular Time With Friends Dementia Cafe, a drop in mental health service with MIND, our Chatty Café on Wednesday which gives isolated, lonely people of all ages a chance to get together with others, and on a Tuesday morning it's Mums & Tots. We also host a bunch of educational workshops and arts activities, so keep a lookout for these. All of this activity only happens if we get wider funding support so, please do contribute a donation to The Corn Hall if you are able to. Like a lot of public facilities we are being hit by higher costs and any donations are greatly welcome to ensure we can continue to be an excellent Community Arts Centre for the people of Diss and surrounds.




Will Teather - Magic Realism




